It was PG&E's understanding that this first phase of the tariff language would be wholly dedicated to addressing the portions of the co-located resources proposal. With that in mind, PG&E seeks clarity as to the purpose of including language unrelated to the *Aggregate Capability Constraint* – Why is *High Sustainable Limit* defined in this phase and not included in phase 2 of the draft tariff language? Also, why is tariff language included regarding VER data requirements prior to the implementation of a non-co-located hybrid resource model?
