#### Stakeholder Engagement Objectives

- Engage the industry to gauge interest from load-serving entities (LSEs) in accessing out-of-state wind resources
- Focus on states with capacity such as Idaho, Wyoming, Arizona, and New Mexico
- Extension of the CAISO's 2021-2022 transmission planning cycle
- Request for expressions of interest on two proposals targeting specific states




### Out-of-state (OOS) wind resources in the CAISO's 2021-2022 transmission plan

- OOS wind resource scenarios studied under the 2021-2022 transmission plan
  - CPUC IRP base portfolio
    - 1,062 MW of capacity in Wyoming, Idaho, or New Mexico areas
    - 530 MW of capacity in Pacific Northwest on existing transmission
  - CPUC IRP Sensitivity 1 portfolio
    - 1,500 MW of capacity in Wyoming, Idaho
    - 1,500 MW of capacity in New Mexico
    - 1,500 MW of capacity in Pacific Northwest and 500 MW of capacity in New Mexico on existing transmission



### Out-of-state Proposed Transmission Projects





#### Proposed approach by the CAISO

- Running an expression of interest for each of the below proposals:
  - Proposal A: Accessing wind resources specifically located in Idaho through transmission projects, either proposed such as the Southwest Intertie Project -North (SWIP-North) transmission project, or future projects.
  - Proposal B: Accessing wind resources in other neighboring states such as Wyoming, New Mexico, and Arizona through transmission projects, either proposed or future projects.
